From the Cantor's Desk:

What makes you Jewish?

No, this is not going to be a discourse on *halacha* (Jewish law). This is a real question I am asking each of you.

For me, there are a number of things. My parents were both Jewish with my father being more observant than my mother. I attended synagogue regularly with my father until he passed away and one of our favorite songs for the car on long trips was Adon Olam — changing the words "b'cheftso kol" to "and Pepsi Cola." I was attending Hebrew School three days a week until I graduated high school and regular participation in services and activities at Synagogue. From college until today, regular synagogue attendance has waxed and waned. When I moved to Taiwan after college, one thing I did was travel an hour every Friday night and Saturday morning to the Jewish Center in the suburbs of Taipei, not because I was particularly observant, but because being half away around the world from home in a completely foreign culture, I wanted something familiar and to fell at home when the holidays would come around. I knew that if I only showed up for Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur services, I would not feel "at home."

What made me feel at home was a combination of familiar ritual, melodies and liturgy, but more than that, it was that I had come to know the other people who were there. I knew their children and had meals with them even though I was the only 20-something in the room. The people there were from all over the world – Americans, Israelis, Russians, Australians, South Americans, Europeans and Chinese spouses who had chosen to join the community, but we were all Jewish, bound together not only by having received the Torah thousands of years ago, or by ethnicity, but also by the social bonds we built by being in community. I returned last week from attending the annual meeting of the Cantors Assembly. I was uplifted by the new music, the concerts and communal prayer and intrigued to hear Israeli-American author Noa Tishby speak to a room of 1600. But by far the most uplifting thing was to be together, joining voices with other Jews in this time when it seems security concerns lead us to make ourselves as small and invisible as possible. There is a physical reaction to the sound waves of people singing together and an emotional uplift to singing and conversing with people. There was also a catharsis to being in a group where I did not feel that I had to hide or worry how the other people in the room would react to my being Jewish, to being myself.

As we approach the holiday of Shavuot (from the evening of June 11 to sundown on June 13), I want to ask you again to make Congregation Beth Israel your community. Join us for programs and services. I am being selfish in requesting this. I need you! I need a community . . . and you may find that you do as well, even if you thought you did not!

SISTERHOOD NEWS

It is with great regret that we announce that Beth Israel Sisterhood is disbanding. After many years of service to Beth Israel through our fundraising, social, and educational meetings, our membership numbers have dwindled. We were unable to field a list of officers to continue due to lack of participation.

Over the past ten or more years, many of the past functions of Sisterhood have been gradually absorbed by the congregation board or discontinued—Break-fast, Condolence dinners, etc.

At the May 6 congregation board meeting, the board agreed to accept several of the remaining roles that Sisterhood has been fulfilling. Leagrams, a long-standing successful fundraiser and an invaluable way for members to support each other, will be continued. Thank you to Hanna Pollack who will continue in the chairmanship under the mantle of the congregation. Judith Clark will continue to chair the Flower Fund, which provides flowers for High Holy Days, will continue again as a function of the Congregation.

Members who wish to continue to support Torah Fund may do so as individuals, but there will be no collection of donations coordinated by a local Torah Fund chair. Torah Fund supports scholarships and programming at The Jewish Theological Seminary in New York, Ziegler School of Rabbinic Studies in Los Angeles, Seminario Rabinico Latinoamericano in Buenos Aires, and Zacharias Frankel College in Potsdam. This was a decision that we made with sadness. Each of us has pleasant memories of our Sisterhood experience, a fun anecdote, a friend that we made while we cooked or worked on fund-raisers together. Thank you to all the members and especially the officers and committee chairs who made Sisterhood so successful through the years. It was an excellent organization for a strong Jewish community in Lebanon. We are sad to see it go.
